Now, when they tried to make Him tell them something, when Satan tried to say, "If thou be the Son of God... Now, You know You have power, turn these stones into bread. Help Yourself. - 14. But if ye have bitter envying and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth. 15. This wisdom descendeth not from above, but is <u>earthly</u>, <u>sensual</u>, [<u>devilish</u>].
- 16. For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work.
- 17. But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy.
