Euodia {yoo-od-ee'-ah}

1) Euodias meaning "fragrant" is a Christian woman at Philippi.

GREEK LEXICON - STRONG'S NUMBER 4941

Suntuche {*soon-too'-khay*}

1) Syntyche meaning "with fate" was a female member of the church of Philippi.

GREEK LEXICON - STRONG'S NUMBER 2815

Klemes {*klay'-mace*}

1) Clement meaning "mild, merciful", was a companion of Paul and apparently a member of the church of Philippi.

II TIMOTHY 1:5

5. When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother [Lois], and thy mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also.

1) Lois meaning "agreeable", was the grandmother of Timothy and doubtless the mother of his mother, Eunice. It seems likely that Lois had resided long at Lystra; and almost certain that from her, as well as Eunice, Timothy obtained his intimate knowledge of the Jewish Scriptures.

HEAR YE HIM [56-0930]

O God, send preachers from this meeting; send missionaries from here. Send them from this convention, Lord, to go out with a new vision into the fields to win souls.
