- 23. For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;
- 24. Being [justified] freely by his grace through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus:

I CORINTHIANS 6:9-11

9. Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind, 10. Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God. 11. And such were some of you: but ye are washed, but ye are sanctified, but ye are [justified] in the name of the Lord Jesus, and by the Spirit of our God.

ROMANS 8:30-33

- 30. Moreover whom he did predestinate, them he also called: and whom he called, them he also [justified]: and whom he [justified], them he also glorified.
- 31. What shall we then say to these things? If God be for us, who can be against us?
- 32. He that spared not his own Son, but delivered him up for us all, how shall he not with him also freely give us all things?
- 33. Who shall lay any thing to the charge of God's elect? It is God that [justifieth].

ROMANS 8:33 [Lamsa translation]

33. Who is to complain against the chosen ones of God? It is God who justifies.

Consider this. Since it is the blood of God, it is perfect blood; and if the perfect blood is loosing us from the power and bondage and defilement of sin, then <u>the loosing is</u> <u>perfect and complete. There is now therefore no condemnation</u>.

"Who shall lay anything to the charge of God's elect? It is God that justifieth (**declares us righteous**). Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died..." Romans 8:33-34.

There it is, His death gave us the blood. The blood has loosed us. There is now no condemnation. How can there be? There is nothing to be condemned for, because the blood has loosed us from sin. We are free, guiltless. Don't listen to man, listen to the Word. You are loosed by the blood.
