WHAT WENT YE OUT TO SEE? [59-1001]

Now, a lot of people has the wrong impression of Christ. Some people thinks that Christ was a sissy. Christ was the greatest of all men. He was the example Man. LUKE 14:7-11

7. And he put forth a parable to those which were bidden, when he marked how they chose out the chief rooms; saying unto them, 8. When thou art bidden of any man to a wedding, sit not down in the highest room; lest a more honourable man than thou be bidden of him; 9. And he that bade thee and him come and say to thee, Give this man place; and thou begin with shame to take the lowest room. 10. But when thou art bidden, go and sit down in the lowest room; that when he that bade thee cometh, he may say unto thee, Friend, go up higher: then shalt thou have worship in the presence of them that sit at meat with thee. 11. For whosoever exalteth himself shall be [abased]; and he that [humbleth] himself shall be exalted.

HEAR YE HIM [58-0126]

...it's that fellow who thinks he's a big man that you can't get along with. Oh, he's just so big you can't touch him. That's the way it goes.

Humble yourself, see how little you can be...

LUKE 18:9-14

9. And he spake this parable unto certain which trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others:

10. Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican.

11. The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican.

12. I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess.

13. And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner.

14. I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be [abased]; and he that [humbleth] himself shall be exalted.

MICAH 6:8

8. He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and <u>what doth the LORD require of thee, but</u> to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God?

THE SEVEN CHURCH AGES [54-0512]

We're in the last day; so be careful. <u>Walk humbly</u>. Have a contrite, broken spirit, a humble heart, willing to let the Holy Spirit lead you.

JAMES 4:10

10. [Humble] yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and he shall lift you up.

<u>I PETER 5:5-7</u>

5. Likewise, ye younger, submit yourselves unto the elder. Yea, all of you be subject one to another, and be <u>clothed with humility</u>: for God resisteth the proud, and giveth grace to the humble. 6. [Humble] yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may <u>exalt you in due time</u>: 7. Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you.
