David

I SAMUEL 16:1-3

- 1. And the LORD said unto Samuel, How long wilt thou mourn for Saul, seeing I have rejected him from reigning over Israel? fill thine horn with oil, and go, I will send thee to Jesse the Bethlehemite: for **I have provided me a king** among his sons.
- 2. And Samuel said, How can I go? if Saul hear it, he will kill me. And the LORD said, Take an heifer with thee, and say, I am come to sacrifice to the LORD.
- 3. And call Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will shew thee what thou shalt do: and thou shalt anoint unto me <u>him whom I name unto thee</u>.

I SAMUEL 16:6-11

- 6. And it came to pass, when they were come, that he looked on Eliab, and said, Surely the LORD'S anointed is before him.
- 7. But the LORD said unto Samuel, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because <u>I have refused him</u>: for <u>the LORD seeth not as man seeth</u>; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but <u>the LORD looketh on the heart</u>.

- 10. Again, Jesse made seven of his sons to pass before Samuel. And Samuel said unto Jesse, <u>The</u> LORD hath not chosen these.
- 11. And Samuel said unto Jesse, Are here all thy children? And he said, There remaineth yet the youngest, and, behold, he keepeth the sheep. And Samuel said unto Jesse, Send and fetch him: for we will not sit down till he come hither.
- 12. And he sent, and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and withal of a beautiful countenance, and goodly to look to. And the LORD said, **Arise**, anoint him: for this is he.
